CONUS finished furniture	Exchanges in CONUS may not sell finished furniture with a per-unit (piece) cost to the exchanges in excess of \$900. CONUS exchanges may not undertake new capital construction or renovation of an exchange facility of any kind for the purpose, in whole or in part, of providing additional space in which to sell finished furniture. At any new installation or location at which the exchange service proposes to sell finished furniture, the exchange manager or installation commander must consult in advance with local furniture merchants. The Military Services exchange must advise the PDUSD(P&R) of the proposal and any local merchant objections to exchange sales of finished furniture. Such notice to the PDUSD(P&R) must be made 60 days before offering finished furniture at any new location. Miscellaneous sports equipment and supplies	Military Services exchanges in CONUS may not sell sports equipment and supplies; recreational, garden, and manual arts equipment and supplies; or photographic supplies and film with a per-unit (piece) cost to the exchange in excess of \$500. There is no cost limitation on aquatic equipment, bicycles, cameras and projectors, camera and projector accessories, fishing equipment, golf club sets, guns and gun accessories, physical fitness exercise equipment, power tools, outdoor power equipment including lawn mowers, edgers and snow blowers, ski equipment, surfboards, and tents.
